



In Mid 2002 I was contemplating a career in the fire service. However I was involved in a accident with a farm tractor cracking my sternum. Due to the severity of the accident my Physician advised against a career in the fire service. This is where my passion for fire apparatus photography began to grow. Me and my 2 daughters (Madison and Makenzey) set out with a basic digital camera to photograph the apparatus of the Albuquerque Fire Department.


Since that time I have upgraded my camera equipment and added a Son to the family. Since this started we have now visited with a total of 93 different departments and photographed over 1200 pieces of apparatus. We have photographed apparatus in Arizona, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas. There have been a lot of great memories and experiences in our journeys. My oldest daughter had the opportunity to ride in a Tiller cab out in Flagstaff while they drove her around the block. The truck was identical to the 1987 Pierce TDA that was in service in Albuquerque at one point. My daughters once got to ride up and down a out of service runway in a P-19. They have had the opportunity to be in the cab while a demonstration was made on how a snozzle is used to pierce the skin of a aircraft. They have been given the opportunity to dress in several different sets of turnout gear. We even came across a department once that had child sized turnout gear in Colorado. My son was absolutely thrilled at being to dress like a "real" firefighter.

Along the way we have had the opportunity to meet some incredibly nice firefighters and hear some absolutely fascinating stories. It has been great to travel and learn the history of so many departments and to see how the fire service and apparatus has changed over the years.






