

After a devastating hurricane that destroyed his home he moved back to the United States.


HONORS GIVEN TO TOM ROMERO

On June 17, 2011, During ceremonies at the 79 th Fire Cadet Graduation held at the Kimo Theater downtown, AFD Retiree Tommy Romero was presented the "Fire Service Recognition Award," by Deputy Chief David Downey.

This award was given to Tommy for his accomplishments during his Fire service career which he continues today as a member of the retiree Association and is still serving with New Mexico Task Force One.

He joined AFD on June 19, 1978 and retired from the department after A 23 year career as a firefighter/ District Chief. His AFD career includes EMT-Paramedic, National Registry, 1980. He was promoted to Lieutenant in 1983, Firefighter of the Year, 1983, and was promoted to Captain in 1987. His career continued as District Chief in 1988 and to Battalion Chief in 1988.

In 1992 Tom assisted AFD in establishment of present day NM Task Force One, he was involved in establishing the N.M. Urban Search and Rescue following the Oklahoma City bombing tragedy.



In 2000 prior to retiring, Tom led a large firefighting contingent of AFD fire firefighters to the City of Los Alamos during the "Cerro Grande" fire. This would be his last emergency while employed as one of Albuquerque's bravest.

When the September 11 th tragedy occurred, Tom Romero was deployed along with AFD firefighters as part of the NM Task Force One to the Pentagon. They spent 11 days and nights assisting in this National tragedy.

In 2003 Tom was selected as program manager in charge of N.M. Task Force One. During 2005, Under his leadership N.M. Task Force One responded to both hurricane Katrina and hurricane Rita. Returning to New Orleans as a volunteer he was involved in rebuilding fire stations that were destroyed by hurricane Katrina. He returned again as a volunteer with his church and assisted in construction of homes that were destroyed by hurricane Katrina

Currently Tom is still involved with N.M. Task Force One utilizing his expertise in Urban Search and Rescue (structure collapse), Weapons of mass destruction, Chemical Plant/Petro Refinery Disaster Safety, and high angle rope rescue.

Tom also has two sons, Chris Romero and Carlos Romero who are active duty firefighters with the Albuquerque Fire Department. Tom resides in Albuquerque with his wife Monica.

Today, Tom is actively involved with the Albuquerque Fire Department Retiree's Association and serves as both a member of the Advisory Board and is a funeral detail honor guard member. He is a valued member of our retiree's association and we are proud to nominate him for this prestigious honor, "Fire Service Recognition Award."

Interesting Facts About Firefighters of Long Ago

Firefighters who were hired during the 1920's 1930's and 1940's. did not have a very good retirement plan. The retirement system for firefighters was rather poor in that era. Usually they worked into their 60's and 70's. The above people worked many years and most were mandatory retired and two died while employed with the Fire Department.

Lieutenant Ed Lucero worked until age 77 as a line officer at Station # 10



<u>Happy Birthday, Sparky The Fire Dog Turns Age 60</u> <u>Fire Prevention Week, October 9, 2011 - October 25, 2011</u>

When the retired firefighters were on active duty we were well Aware of Fire Prevention Week and always observed this important Date each year during the week from Sunday to Saturday in which October 9 th falls. This year Fire Prevention week is from Sunday October 9, 2011 to Saturday October 15, 2011.

Sparky the fire dog is celebrating his 60 th birthday this year. He Has been the official spokesdog for the National Fire Protection Association since 1951. Sparky is loved by children, adults, and Firefighters. Each year he spreads the fire safety message through Pictures, coloring books, videos, posters, and other educational Materials.



The intention of National Fire Prevention Week for the past 80 years is to raise awareness about the dangers of fires and how to prevent them. "NFPA.s" theme this year is "Team Up For Fire Safety." This year's campaign includes: A.-Installing and testing fire alarms. B.- Practicing home escape plans. C. Hunting for home fire hazards.

Fire Prevention Week commemorates the Great Chicago Fire conflagration that began on Sunday, October 8, 1871 and lasted to early Tuesday October 10, 1871. Over 300 people died and the fire burned four square miles. A prolonged drought prior to the fire, high winds, and the City's over use of wood in building construction were the main factors contributing to the rapid spread of the fire.

The firefighters were soon overwhelmed by the fast moving fire and lack of water supply. In addition to high winds the fire created it's own winds which blew embers to buildings ahead of the fire. Unfortunately the fire destroyed the City's water works early on.

Finally the fire burned itself out aided by diminishing winds, and a light drizzle that began falling by late Monday night.

During 1925 President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed October 4, 1925 to October 10, 1925 the first "National Fire Prevention Week."

For years Catherine O'Leary was blamed for the fire when her cow supposedly kicked over a lantern while she was milking in the barn. Michael Ahern a reporter for the "Chicago Tribune," came up with the story because the fire started near Mrs. O'Leary's barn. In 1893 Ahern retracted the "Cow and Lantern" story admitting it was fabricated.

Some other stories have surfaced as to the fire cause. Amateur historian Richard Bales believes the fire was started when Richard "Pegleg" Sullivan who first reported the fire, had ignited the hay while stealing milk. Dennis Regan a resident of Chicago and a neighbor of the O'leary's is believed to be an accomplice of Sullivan.

Recent evidence reported by Anthony DeBartolos suggest Louis M. Cohn may have started the fire during a crap game. He is thought to have admitted to starting the fire in a last will.

To this very day the experts say the cause of the "Great Chicago Fire" is not absolutely certain.


